"Thirsting for God"

As the deer pants for the water brooks, so pants my soul for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and appear before God? My tears have been my food day and night, while they continually say to me, "Where is your God?" I will say to God my Rock, "Why have you forgotten me? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?" As with a breaking of my bones, my enemies reproach me, While they say to me all day long. "Where is your God?" Why are you cast down, O my soul? And why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; for I shall yet praise Him, the help of my countenance and my God. Psalm 42:1-3 and 9-11

The Psalmist felt that God was remote and distant. Have you ever felt that way? I know that I have, many times. The psalmist expressed his deep longing for God as being comparable to the intense thirst of a deer for water during a time of severe drought. The poet longed to enjoy the assurance of God's presence with him, just once more. How many times have you experienced this same longing? I believe that all who belong to God experience times when God seems absent, and they long for the reassurance of His presence. Psalms 42 and 43 provide guidance in such times.

Have there been times in your life when it seemed like you had a lot more bad days than good days...when nothing seemed to be going right? Who did you blame for your troubles? Others? Yourself? God? We often blame God, don't we? We have all heard the question: *If there is a God, why does he allow bad things to happen to good people?* If you look at Psalm 43 you will find that even though the Psalmist wondered where God was...as we all do at times...he did not blame God...no, not even once! Instead, the Psalmist yearns...craves...longs more deeply for God to draw closer. Even when those around him ask, 'Where is your God?" He doesn't turn away from God or get angry at God, or even complain against God. We see the Psalmist *remembering* the days that he went with the multitudes to the house of God in joy and praise! Those were the days!

What did the psalmist do? He began to count his blessings. How about you? Do you remember the days of God's blessings in your life? Or do you complain against God about how troubled your life has become? When times get tough what do you do? Do you draw closer to God or blame God and push him away? Do you respond like the psalmist who said to himself, "Why are you cast down, O my soul?....Hope in God; for I shall yet praise Him, the help of my countenance and my God." This psalmist pays no attention to those around him who tease and torment him about God forgetting him. Instead of throwing himself a pity-party and feeling sorry for himself, or getting mad at God, he looks to God and says, "I will praise Him again; He is my help and my God!"

The psalmist gave himself a pep-talk! He knew that God was with him even if he couldn't sense God's presence. God was there and by *faith* he believed that God would see him through to better days. He held to the *faith* that would eventually move mountains for him and give him strength to keep going during the most difficult of days. He knew that God was a promise keeper, God was with him.

I remember one very hot mission trip to Mountain Top in Tennessee with my youth group from Lizton. It was 106 degrees outside and we were tarring a metal roof. All the kids were complaining about the heat..."Why would they send us up here ...it's so hot...when can we go back?" and on and on they complained. Of all the weeks of the summer why did God make this one so hot? I had to find a way to turn their cries of mutiny in to cries of hope and praise. I started asking some questions: Did God say serving him would be easy? How do you suppose Paul and the other disciples felt on their mission trips? Do you think they ran into trouble? Did you ever read in Paul's writings where he complained about doing God's work? No... Paul, like the psalmist simply praises God and longs for him more! In faith he holds true to his calling.

We were all craving a tall glass of ice water...something to quench our thirsty bodies. We talked about our craving for something cold...a pool of ice water to jump in... a tall frozen slushy...a snow cone. All we had with us was a 5 gallon cooler of very warm lemonade. I turned the conversation to God again and asked, "How many of you crave God right now like you are craving for something cold to drink?" That is the longing that God craves from us! On the way home I bought everyone a large slushy to drink...and I reminded them that God's Spirit can refresh our souls like the slushy refreshes your body. God uses our circumstances to help us mature on our journey of faith. God IS with us... even when we can't see or feel his presence! *Pray today that no matter what the circumstances, you look to God in faith and say, "I will praise you again; you are my help and my God!"*
