

"We Gotta' Tell Everybody!"

When the angels had gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us now go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us." And they came with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the Babe lying in a manger. Now when they had seen Him, they made widely known the saying which was told them concerning this Child. And all those who heard it marveled at those things which were told them by the shepherds (Luke 2:15-18).

Many years ago, when our children were just three and seven years old, Byron and I took them on a special overnight trip. We drove to a large church in northern Indiana to participate in the Bethlehem Walk. It was an interactive living nativity that was comprised of life sized sets of first century Bethlehem and actors reenacting the scenes from Jesus' life. Our children were excited to see all the real animals: goats, sheep, ducks, chickens, donkeys, and best of all...real camels! The scenes depicted the visit of the Angel Gabriel to Mary, the birth of Jesus, and scenes from his life, death and resurrection. For three weekends before Christmas people from all over the state came to hear about the real meaning of Christmas. It was awesome!

We were guided through the sets by a tour host who would tell us the story of Jesus as we wandered through each of the sets. When we got to the manger, our tour host invited all the little children to come forward and see the baby Jesus. They crowded in close, eyes wide, like they had never seen anything like it before. They watched in awe as Mary sang "Silent Night" as she cradled baby Jesus in her arms. Joseph was standing by Mary with his hand on her shoulder. And as soon as Mary had finished her song one little boy shouted, "Look Mom, it's Jesus! Wow! We gotta' tell everybody!" We all chuckled and thought it was really cute…but to that little boy, Jesus was real!

I have thought about the little boys words many times. He was absolutely right. We gotta' tell everybody! The shepherds did just that after the angels told them where to find the baby Jesus. And after finding him they had to tell the Good News of great joy; salvation had come for all people! They couldn't keep quiet! They told everyone who would listen to them that the Messiah was born. Honestly, how could they keep it to themselves, having seen what they had seen? How can we ourselves keep quiet, having heard the Good News, experiencing Christ first-hand, and having been redeemed by Christ our Savior?

In the great commission in Matthew 28:16-20 Jesus tells his disciples to go and tell the Good News to all nations. If you, like so many other Christians today, ever feel unqualified to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ, simply remember the shepherds. They were the most unlikely messengers to proclaim the Messiah's birth. They were a rowdy bunch... poor, unclean, rough; second class citizens...the outcasts of their day. God sent the angels to the shepherds to proclaim the news, he could have just as easily chosen the angels to tell all the citizens of Bethlehem that the Messiah was born... but God chose the shepherds. He used them as the first-ever evangelists of the Gospel. Just as the shepherds could not keep quiet about what they had seen after they found baby Jesus, so it should be for us. We gotta' tell everybody! How could we do anything less? Be excited about your faith in Jesus Christ as your Messiah. Share the joy of your salvation with everyone who will listen. This Christmas season, share the good news, not just of Jesus as the baby in the manger, but of Jesus, Son of God, who came to dwell among us... who came and sacrificed his life for us so that we could live forever with him in heaven. Celebrate the gift of Christmas, and proclaim the joy of your salvation to the Word! Have a blessed and Merry Christmas!

We got to make cornbread and then eat it for lunch!




